1. PRESS RELEASE

Europe's largest technology event, Web Summit, hosting two day Fintech event in Madrid

- First year the event is being hosted in Madrid, was held in Belfast in 2015
- The two day event will see over 100 speakers who are changing the financial sector through technology take to the stage
- Over 80 of the world's top fintech startups will exhibit at the event

Next week on 21 and 22 June over 1,500 people from the world of fintech will come to La Neve, Madrid to take part in MoneyConf. This invite-only event is being brought to Madrid by the organisers of the world's largest startup event Web Summit.

MoneyConf is the most important global meeting place for leading financial institutions and disruptive startups - an event for entrepreneurs, investors, startups and the global financial powerhouses to gather in one intimate space.

Organisers moved the event to Madrid for 2016 from Belfast after seeing what a up and coming tech hub the city has become along with its importance in the world of finance.

Traditional banks have been slow to catch onto the fintech bandwagon, but Spanish banks like BBVA and Santander have been some of the first to react.
